## 2016 CBA BOOTCAMP

### Saturday, April 23 - Thursday, April 28

The 2016 CBA Conference Bootcamp is an opportunity for **25 prospective or emerging community builders** to learn about community built practices through hands-on experiences and interactive presentations. Participants must apply for this program, attend the regular conference, and be prepared to "camp" and assist with food preparation. "Bootcampers" will work with experienced community built practitioners and will learn various hand-construction skills, how to develop and make presentations, group facilitation skills, and engage in various learning modalities, including role-plays and discussion groups. We will also cover asset mapping, and funding and evaluation strategies. Bootcampers will also play a major role in running the regular conference, including hosting the kick-off evening, assisting presenters, orienting others to the ongoing projects, and facilitate an end-of-conference evaluation process. Bootcampers are expected to work hard, and bring their "A" game to the table. Each day starts at 8am and continues until 9pm.
